HEATING AT ST MARY'S, WOODBRIDGE – A message from Fr Nigel: "Thank you for your patience and resilience over these last weeks. It was a very difficult time for us in the run-up to and over Christmas to discover that the Church's boilers, which were already reaching end-of-life, had deteriorated to the extent as to become potentially dangerous despite maintenance in March.

We are very grateful to David Sharples and Simon Morris who quickly reacted and procured emergency industrial heaters, and to Alan Hunter, our electrician, who ensured that our electrical supply could cope with the extra power needed.

The PCC has agreed to fund works to provide additional electrical capacity for an extra 'blower' and to purchase two new 'blowers'. The capital and running costs are expensive, but purchasing is more economic than continuing to hire. In parallel we are prioritizing research into a replacement for the gas boilers. This and other dioceses will not support the installation of new heating systems that rely on gas. We have involved our architect and heating specialists. At the same time, as Rector, I'm grateful for the time given voluntarily to this by our Churchwardens, our Projects Manager, and others.

Please bear with us as we find out more and do our very best to consider the heating strategy that respects the heritage and future use of one of Suffolk's largest and loftiest Churches, well before the deadline for Net Zero touches all of our lives by 2030.
